EMERGING SKILLS DURING AGE RANGE

- □ On average, uses 250-1000 words
- □ Able to say first name, age, and gender
- □ Starts to understand or recognize colors, shapes, and family members
- □ Labels pictures
- □ Understands spatial concepts, for example in, on, off
- □ Answers simple who, what, when, where questions
- ☐ Uses pronouns, for example me, we, you
- □ Unfamiliar listeners understand them most of the time
- □ Puts 4+ words together
- □ Begins to jump with two feet
- □ Talks about their day
- □ Copies a picture of a circle and a cross
- □ Strings beads together
- □ Removes screw-on lid from a bottle or container
- □ Rides a trike
- □ Visually tracks to catch and throw a ball
- □ Unbuttons and buttons items
- ☐ Throwing begins at the shoulder
- □ Catches a large ball with their arms/chest
- □ Walks up the stairs with alternating feet
- □ Able to stand on one foot for 5 seconds

Developmental Toys & Activities

- → Play outside: Run, jump, swing, crawl
- → Go to play groups and/or activities
- → Play counting games, for example count the stair or number of forks, etc.
- → To practice standing on one leg, start with one foot propped on a step then transition to no step
- → More complex puzzles of 4-9 pieces
- → Coloring or craft activities
- → Lego projects
- → Beading projects
- → Play and pretend: kitchen and food, babies, doctor kit
- → Sing songs like "Wheels on the Bus" and encourage imitation of the actions
- → Letter and number tracing activities or tracing letters of name
- → Simple board games for turn taking and learning rules
